Please make sure their name is labeled in the sweater or jacket and practice putting it on and zipping it up at home.

HELPFUL SUGGESTIONS FOR PARENTS OF KINDERGARTEN STUDENTS

- Letters, sounds and sight words should be reviewed and practiced every night.
- Make sure that your child's completed work is clean and neat.
- Have your child use a pencil to do the homework.
- Have your child color with crayons the letter bubbles, the pictures, etc. on the page. This reinforces taking pride in their work as well as fine motor skills.
- Provide a quiet place for your child to do his/her work.
- Review your child's work with him/her before returning it to school.
- Have your child return all of the completed homework assignments.
